Earth Kids 2020

We have a new bunch of committed, enthusiastic Earth Kids representatives (REPS) from every class in the school. We are looking forward to sharing ideas of SUSTAINABILITY that classes have been discussing and it is our intention to encourage and lead school wide projects over the course of the year. The HALO group will be setting out predator tracking tunnels to find out what is lurking in our school grounds. When they have gathered their data the team will share their findings with the Earth Kids which will be fed back to the classes.
